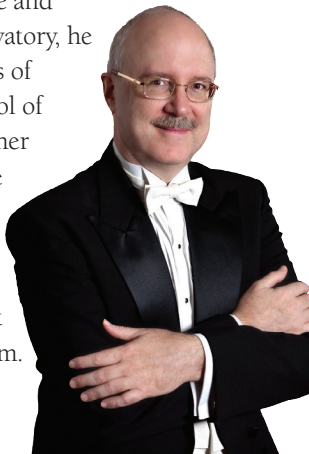


THE SANDY SPRING MUSEUM

JEFFREY CHAPPELL

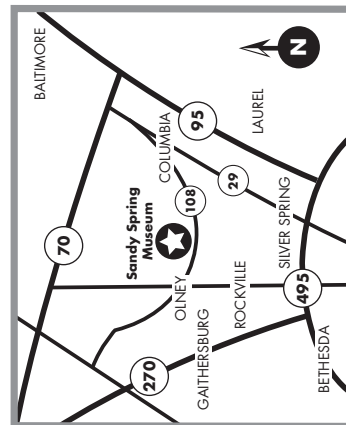
